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Case report: primary cutaneous mucinous carcinoma

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Abstract:

The primary cutaneous mucinous carcinoma is a rare malignant tumor, which is thought to be a sweat gland origin. It is mainly located on the head, particularly on the face and it tends to develop in middle-aged people or elders. Typically, it is a slow-growing tumor and presents as an erythematous lesion at first. The main treatment is complete resection and it usually has good prognosis.

We would like to present a case of primary cutaneous mucinous carcinoma which is arising on the chin, undergoing the wide excision, platysma myocutaneous flap and FTSG.
